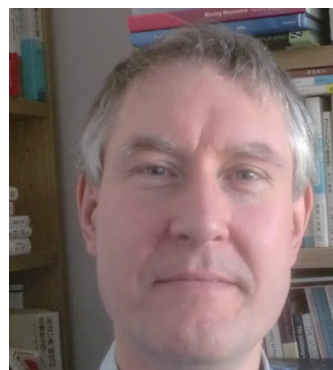
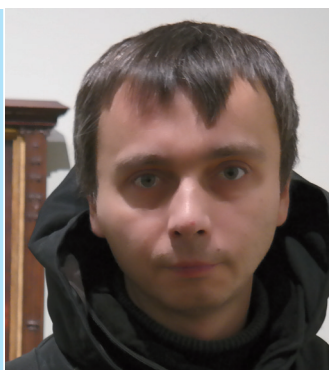

This course will focus on the impacts of climate change on food production systems, especially on rice production systems. As is well known, unprecedented economic and industrial developments have been achieved in our world, however resulting in severe pollution and environmental disturbance problems in ecosystems consequently. Ecology mainly deals with the totality of relationships among biological and abiological components in ecological systems to address abundance/distribution of populations/communities, and energy efficiency and biogeochemical cycling in ecosystems. The efforts to restore the damaged ecosystems have been greatly emphasized, striving to reestablish precious ecosystems through monitoring, conservation, and recovery. In this course the students will learn how effectively ecological sciences could be realized to achieve the goal of ecosystem safety, stability and sustainability in the sharply contrasting ecological situations, severe anthropogenic impacts versus serious efforts to restore damages. In addition to basic concepts in ecology, recent progress and future perspectives will be discussed with the focus on linking society and academic fields including interfacing ecological objects (e.g., individual animal, landscape), mobile sensor networks, eco-evolutionary processes, molecular ecology, and social collaborations. The course would provide 1) history and scope of ecology, 2) key concepts in ecology regarding abundance, distribution, bio-diversity, energy efficiency, and biogeochemical cycling at different hierarchical levels in life systems (e.g., population, community, ecosystem), 3) ecology from functional/methodological aspects including different academic disciplines, and 4) realization of ecological principles in human societies.

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Geographic Information Systems (GIS) technology can be widely applied to a broad spectrum of natural and social sciences, humanities, environmental studies, engineering, and management. Examples include urban and regional planning, disease mapping, agricultural monitoring, wildlife habitat mapping, emergency management, transportation planning, consumer analysis, and more. This course will help students understand the foundations of GIS and learn practical skills for applying GIS and spatial analysis to solve real-world geographical problems. This course will require students bring a Windows-based laptop to class with appropriate software installed. We will use Quantum GIS (QGIS), which can be downloaded freely from the Internet, and Esri ArcGIS Desktop, which is available as a free 180-day trial license included in the course textbook (see the syllabus for details).

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This course will examine two popular films about education. *Freedom Writers* is set in Los Angeles at a time of social unrest. It depicts a young teacher faced with very difficult students, addressing the wider context of racial tension and social unrest. *Educating Rita* is a humorous film that follows the experience of a mature student who embarks on a university course when she is in her late 20s. The film raises questions of social class and the difficulties of access to education. Both films consider education as a process of transformation, where experience in the classroom inevitably connects with the wider social context. Both raise questions about identity and about the relation to the past. They ask what education is for. The approach to the films will be a critical one, considering the ways that images of schooling and university life are turned into images for popular entertainment. The course will consider the effects of these forms of representation on notions of identity and human transformation.

The course probes into the all-encompassing impact on the perception of the world imposed by the languages we speak. Not only in grammar, differences between languages are ever present and they attest to the fact that the world around the man is not homogeneous, but differently structured, and there are at least as many structures of the world as the number of languages in which the world is being perceived. This is one of the fundamental problems in the theory and practice of translation: the process of transmitting the "world literature" to the "world." The course will begin with the history of the concept of "world literature" (Johann Wolfgang von Goethe), the history of the debate on the relationship between language and thought and an outline of theoretical perspectives on translating literary texts. After this introductory theoretical part, the course will examine the process of solving difficulties posed by differences in linguistic vision of the world in the work of some outstanding translators. The focus will lie on translations of Lewis Carroll's Alice's Adventures in Wonderland into Chinese, French, German, Italian, Japanese, and Russian. Course participants are not expected to be proficient in all these languages, as all the translation instances will be re-translated into English by the lecturer.

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The Purpose of the course is to provide a descriptive and dynamical understanding of the importance of tidal phenomena in the Universe. The goal of the course is to gain an understanding of tidal forces using basic math and dynamical descriptions, and to apply this dynamical understanding to explain various tidal phenomena ranging from well-studied Earth/Moon example to modern, novel studies (e.g. tidal heating of icy satellites, migration of exoplanets). Modern speculations on further tidal effects and the importance of tidal dynamics shall also be discussed.

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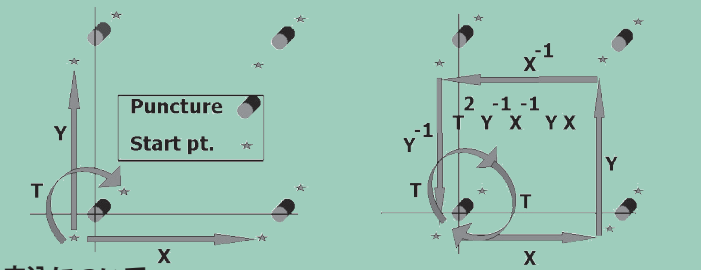
The Bessel functions are the key to the classical theory of special functions. They were a must for quite a few generations of mathematicians and physicists, but not anymore. However, a recent breakthrough made their theory much more general, understandable and algebraic. We will study them and then focus on the related theory of Hankel transform, which is a generalization of the classical Fourier transform; our approach is simple and transparent due to the algebraic methods we will use. We assume no prior knowledge of the Fourier transform. The main tool is the so-called rational Double Affine Hecke algebras (rational DAHA), which is a deformation of the celebrated Heisenberg algebra. Only the case of one variable will be considered and the exposition will be from scratch. We will start from the Heisenberg algebra. After that the definition of the rational DAHA takes few lines. No knowledge of special functions is required; only basic facts from linear algebra and differential equations will be actually used. There is almost no place in natural sciences where Fourier-type transforms are not used; wavelets, quantum computing, string theory are among applications. This mini-course is a good introduction to modern Fourier theory (from an algebraic perspective).

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This course introduces students to qualitative approaches to social research. It examines the purpose of using qualitative methods, and some fundamental methodological issues when using these approaches. It also gives a practical introduction to central qualitative social research tools such as interviews, questionnaires, and observation. Students discuss actual research case studies, and undertake practical exercises to help them gain a better understanding of issues involved in this type of research. There is a special focus on educational research.
