[授業の概要・目的]

This course offers an introduction to the major religions of the world, including Islam, Hinduism, Buddhism, Eastern Religions, Judaism, and Christianity. What are the differences and similarities between these religions? When, where and how did they originate, and how have they developed over time? What are their sacred texts, philosophical ideas and common values? What kinds of rituals are performed by the members of each faith? The purpose of this course is to answer these questions in a way that compares various World Religions, especially in light of the global forces that have shaped them to the present day.

This course has two main learning outcomes: The first (1) is the ability to offer a comparative analysis each of the world 's major religions, drawing from basic understanding of their history, sacred texts, philosophical ideas and patterns of ritual worship. Secondly, (2) students will develop the ability to comment on how religion impacts upon a wide range of social, political and cultural issues that affects modern society around the globe.
