What is religion? How has it been understood by the most important thinkers and scholars in the social sciences? How has the very idea of religion led to the development of social science itself? The course explores how the attempt to describe and analyse religion is part of the history of ideas that shaped the major scholarly disciplines such as anthropology, sociology, political science, economics, history, linguistics, and critical theory. The course will cultivate two learning areas: (1) a basic understanding of the approaches and methodologies that have been used in the study of religious phenomena, and (2) a critical discussion of the various moral and ethical issues that arise from contemporary social scientific analyses of religion.

At the end of this course, students will be able to (1) describe how some of the world 's major thinkers and intellectuals have engaged with the topic of religion over the past two centuries. From this intellectual platform, students will be equipped to (2) describe how the concept of religion itself has evolved in ways that is relevant to the various social, cultural and environmental conditions in which it can be observed.
