[授業の概要・目的]

This class introduces students to the emergence of religious studies and philosophy as western disciplines in modern Japan. Strictly speaking, neither religion nor philosophy was new to modern Japan, but the western academic approach and the language used to discuss them were new developments. In particular, this class will look at the intersection of religion and philosophy from the late Edo period onward as indigenous thoughts mixed with foreign ones.

As central figures in this process, Masaharu Anesaki (the founder of religious studies in modern Japan) and Tetsujiro Inoue (a prominent philosopher at Tokyo University) will be considered, along with their ongoing debate over the nature of philosophy and religion. In addition to Anesaki and Inoue, Seiichi Hatano (founder of Christian Studies at Kyoto University) and Enryo Inoue will be considered.

This course is structured as a freshman seminar class and so will be limited in size. Students will take turns leading discussion of/presenting the reading material, but all students will be expected to comment and/or ask questions.

Homework will be limited to reading approximately 5-10 pages of text per week and, for the presenter(s), crafting a summary outline for presentation in class (once per person). This should take no more than 1-2 hours per week, so the homework load is not unmanageable.

All the reading material will be prepared by the instructor and provided on the first day of class. Approximately the first half of the course will utilize Japanese language material and the second half will utilize primarily English language material.

[到達目標]

By the end of the class, students should have a general understanding of the process by which contemporary academic approaches to religion and philosophy developed in Japan. This seminar will serve as a preparatory class to higher level classes on religious studies and philosophy. It will also aid in equiping students to engage in discussions with informed people from both east and west. Finally, it provides an opportunity to look at a local movement from a detached, objective perspective.
