Today's societies face major challenges such as maintaining liberal values and securing global peace. Since its rise in the 18th century, anthropology (the 'study of man') attempts to provide knowledge about the functioning and the possibilities of development of human beings for fastering a humanistic world society. This seminar will introduce students to basic anthropological considerations from both historical and systematic perspectives. We will take a look at the rise of anthropology in the 18th century in Europe (e.g., Rousseau, Humboldt) and trace different approaches of anthropological research that have developed since then. 
