# [Overview and purpose of the course]

The course is proposed for already advanced students. It will be given in French only and requires a good level.

It gives a preparation to DELF and DALF diplomas (exams organized by the French Ministry of Education to certify linguistic skills).

The class will focus on the preparation of exercices of DELF B2 and DALF C1, exams that are required to enter famous selective schools and universities in France.

Through many documents about French culture and contemporary society, we will develop the capacities to debate and analyse graphs and opinions, to describe a scene and to express a point of view. Grammar and vocabulary will be used on thematic sessions.

# [Course objectives]

- -to improve one's reading, writing, and oral skills
- -to prepare DELF, the proficency exam designed by the French Ministry of Education.
- -to analyze and sum up a document, to debate and express an opinion, to understand a radio talk.

### [Course schedule and contents)]

After an introductory lecture (week 1) presenting the goals and exercises of the class, during the remaining weeks 2 to 14, we will train on various exercises, fitting the schemes of the exam : oral and written comprehension, oral and written production.

The class will be held in French and requires an advanced level.

### [Evaluation methods and policy]

There shall be an intermediary test and, at the end of the semester, a final DELF test. However, the global grade will be given in consideration not only of these tests but also of the attendance and activity during the whole semester.

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
