[Overview and purpose of the course]												

This course is designed to provide students who have already studied French with the opportunity to systematize and reinforce their knowledge of French vocabulary, grammar, pronunciation, and culture. This course will allow students to work further on their command of written and spoken French.

The content and method will focus on the preparation for the DELF, the proficiency exam designed by the French Ministry of Education. During the semester, we will proceed with the A2 and B1 levels (intermediate levels).

-identify and discuss fundamental elements of French culture
