[Overview and purpose of the course]							
<p>This class is designed for advanced students of French. In this class, students will practice written and spoken French in a variety of contexts. They will improve oral expression and conversation, as well as consolidate their grammar and lexical use.</p> <p>Through various documents (articles, videos, radio programs), the course aims to strengthen the students' prior knowledge of French culture and society. It will allow them to develop their capacities to debate and analyse graphs and opinions, as well as to describe a scene or to express a point of view.</p> <p>Finally, the class will focus on the preparation of DELF B2 and DALF C1, exams that are required to enter famous selective schools and universities in France.</p> <p>The class will be conducted in French.</p>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Strengthen listening comprehension and reading from documents based on current events - Consolidate grammar and lexical use - Increase knowledge on oral and written structures in French applied to academic (or formal) speaking and writing - Develop oral skills - Prepare for the DELF

<p>After an introductory lecture (week 1) presenting the goals and exercises of the class, we will train on various exercises, fitting the schemes of the exam : oral and written comprehension, oral and written production (week 2-14).</p> <p>Total:14 classes and 1 feedback</p>
