#### [授業の概要・目的]

This is designed as an introductory course that will familiarise students with several of the critical debates that have shaped environmental history writings on South Asia. The emphasis will be on rehearing not only the distinct conceptual and theoretical claims but, significantly as well, survey the rich and complex socioecological worlds that have been revealed such writing on South Asia.

## [到達目標]

This course will help students understand the unique histories of ecological change in South Asia. In particular, the drastic ecological changes that occurred in the nineteenth century: deforestation, systematic elimnation of wild life and the introduction of modern river control. Environmental history will help students understand that environments are not the frozen backdrop to human drama but are very much part of the making of human history.

#### [授業計画と内容]

Each class will comprise a 90 minute session; involving a lecture of 60 minutes and followed by a 30 minute interactive discussion in which student participation will also be elicited through either group or individual presentations.

Four themes will be covered:

- a) The Colonial Watershed Thesis
- b) Continuity and Change
- c) Forest Protection, Hunting and Colonial Hydrology
- d) Conservation, environmental change and the Colonial State

Total 14 classes and 1 feedback session.
