## [Overview and purpose of the course]

This course will focus on the following areas: 1) Understanding meaning: deducing the meaning of unfamiliar words and word groups; relations within the sentence/complex sentences; implications - information not explicitly stated, conceptual meaning, e.g. comparison, purpose, cause, effect. 2) Understanding relationships in the text: - text structure; the communicative value of sentences; relations between the parts of a text through lexical and grammatical cohesion devices and indicators in discourse. 3) Understanding important points; distinguishing the main ideas from supporting detail; recognising unsupported claims and claims supported by evidence - fact from opinion; extracting salient points to summarise; following an argument; reading critically/evaluating the text. 4) Reading efficiently: surveying the text, chapter/article, paragraphs, skimming for gist/ general impression; scanning to locate specifically required information; reading quickly.

The goal of this course is to assist students in developing the reading skills necessary to comprehend challenging English texts.

The course will be supported by an online learning management system.
