[Overview and purpose of the course]							
<p>受講生は社会科学分野の文章を読み進め、学術的な関心・理解を深めるのに必要な日本語運用能力を向上させる。また、読みとった内容について、専門用語を用いながら、読み手を意識した文章にまとめる。</p> <p>本授業前半では、社会問題を扱った一般向け文献や専門分野の入門書など、学術的要素を含みつつ比較的読みやすい多様な分野の文献を読み、筆者の主張とそれを支える根拠を読み取る。</p> <p>本授業後半では、前半部分並びに前期に提供される日本語上級（文献講読IA）で習得した社会科学分野の基本語彙、基本表現をもとに、まずそれぞれの学生が講読計画を立て、より専門性の高い文献の講読、要約の執筆を行う。</p> <p>Students will read texts in the field of social sciences and improve their Japanese language skills necessary to develop their academic interest and understanding. They will also summarize what they have read, using technical terms, in a text with the reader in mind.</p> <p>In the first half of the course, students will read and comprehend introductory books, general books covering social issues and articles of academic fields.</p> <p>In the latter half of the course, based on the basic vocabulary and expressions in the social sciences acquired in the first half and the first semester of Advanced Japanese (Academic Reading IA), each student will first make a reading plan, read more specialized literature, and write an abstract.</p>

(5) To attain a level of proficiency equivalent to the JLPT N1 or CEFR C1-C2 levels upon completion of Advanced Japanese(Reading IA) and Advanced Japanese(Reading IB).
