This course provides an overview of the cognitive linguistics (CL) enterprise, primarily using English as a language of illustration. CL, unlike mainstream formal approaches to language, posits that language knowledge and use are grounded in basic language-independent cognitive abilities (such as categorisation and attention), that language is experienced through the body (i.e., it is embodied) and, more generally, that language cannot be described as a self-contained 'module' in our mind. The course covers a wide range of phenomena, thus making it well-suited for students from diverse backgrounds. Topics include categorisation (e.g, prototypes and frequency effects), construal operations (e.g., how the same event can de depicted in alternate ways), figurative language (e.g., metaphor and metonymy), language as a network of constructions, and applications of CL in fields such as language acquisition and language teaching.
