[授業の概要・目的]									
<p>The Earth was born as a "fireball" of mixed molten rock and metal; after subsequent hardening, it was very similar with the other "inner" planets: Mars, Venus and Mercury. However, Life was formed only on planet Earth. Why Earth followed a different destiny from other planets? During this lecture we will follow the history of Earth's evolution, from its formation until present days. To facilitate understanding and encourage active participation during the class, some materials and vocabulary in Japanese will be also provided.</p>

<p>The student will familiarize with the most important events in the Earth history and will be able to understand the formation and structure of planet Earth.</p>									
[授業計画と内容]									
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Formation of the Solar System and the Earth; - Structure of the Earth; - Beginning of Plate Tectonics; - Birth and evolution of Life; - Atmosphere evolution: oxygen and carbon dioxide; - The supercontinent cycle; - Continent fragmentation and magmatic activity; - Macro-evolution of Life and extinction episodes. <p>For each of the topics above, we plan 1-2 lectures. There will be in total 15 classes, including the feedback class.</p>

<p>At the beginning of the course, you do not need specific knowledge of Earth Sciences. However, self-study is required to learn the essential knowledge necessary for the course.</p>
