<b>[授業の概要・目的]</b>									
<p>Contrary to the common image of anthropology (e.g., studying the ‘strange’ social institutions and practices of ‘exotic’ peoples), an increasing number of studies in this domain have analyzed everyday interactions among ordinary people. One justification for this approach is that it provides an opportunity to study how persons and sociocultural worlds mutually constitute each other. The theory of language socialization, developed from linguistic anthropology, presents a perspective that children do not develop or acquire cognitive abilities during their growth process (as most psychological theories assume), but rather learn to perform situationally appropriate actions by utilizing various semiotic resources, including those beyond language. Building on this perspective, we have systematically investigated the process of language socialization in Japan / among Japanese. This course introduces findings from these studies, which elucidate the process by which children expand their temporal and spatial scope for appropriate behavior within culturally framed interactions. It contributes to deepening our understanding of how the lifeworld characterizing their speech community is produced, maintained, and transformed.</p>

<p>In this course, we will develop the above areas of interest by analyzing selected domains of everyday life based on various ethnographic materials. The attendants become able to apply what they have learned to explain the interactions around them.</p>
