<b>[授業の概要・目的]</b>									
Action, Agency, and the Shape of a Life									
<p>Human action can be understood as the realization of thought in the world. When we act, we do not merely produce bodily movements or external effects; we give form to our understanding of what is to be done. Examining how thought becomes actual in action helps us to understand not only what we do, but also how we come to know the world and ourselves through acting within it.</p> <p>This course introduces philosophical reflection on human action and agency, with particular attention to how actions, decisions, and commitments contribute to the overall shape of a human life.</p> <p>Rather than focusing on abstract theory alone, we will examine ordinary human activities - choosing, acting for reasons, trying, acting together, failing, and changing - in order to better understand what it is to be an agent over time. Along the way, students will encounter influential ideas from twentieth- and twenty-first-century philosophy that continue to shape contemporary debates about freedom, responsibility, and self-understanding.</p> <p>No prior knowledge of philosophy is assumed. Lectures will use PowerPoint. Each class will consist of approximately 60 minutes of lecture followed by group discussion and the use of a shared document to facilitate interaction. Active participation during the lectures is encouraged.</p>

<p>Students will gain an understanding of central philosophical questions about human action, agency, and responsibility.</p> <p>Students will become familiar with key concepts used in contemporary philosophy to make sense of action, decision-making, and practical reasoning.</p> <p>Students will develop their ability to reason critically, to analyse philosophical ideas, and to express their own views clearly in English.</p>

#### 【履修要件】
