[授業の概要・目的]

This course explores how societies respond to disasters through memory-making, cultural practices, social resilience, and reconstruction. Drawing on anthropology, heritage studies, and disaster research, we will examine how individuals and communities cope with disruption, maintain ties to place, and create meaning through memorials, museums, storytelling, and rituals.

This course is designed to complement Disaster and Culture (1st semester) but can also be taken independently.

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Students will:

- Understand core concepts related to post-disaster recovery (such as resilience, place attachment, etc.)
- Analyze the role of social and cultural components in reconstruction, recovery and resilience.
- Discuss how memory and commemoration shape collective understandings of disaster.
- Evaluate the function and ethics of museums, memorials, and public history in post-disaster contexts.
- Develop critical perspectives through global case studies.

[授業計画と内容]

Week 1: Introduction: Framing the aftermath: what happens after disaster?
Week 2: Theories of Resilience: Cultural and social resilience frameworks
Week 3: Place Attachment: Emotional, symbolic, and political ties to place
Week 4: Displacement and Return: Disaster migration, relocation, and loss
Week 5: Collective Memory: Memory, forgetting, and narrative
Week 6: Group work on case studies (ex: Tohoku, Katrina)
Week 7: Museums and memorials I: Institutions of memory
Week 8: Museums and memorials II: Ethics of representation
Week 9: Cultural heritage: Loss, preservation, and resilience through heritage
Week 10: Case studies: Comparative recovery and memory projects
Week 11: Student presentations and peer feedback
Week 12: Emerging trends: digital memory, oral history, and local knowledge
Week 13: Thinking resilience critically
Week 14: Closing Session: Final reflections and synthesis

The above schedule is tentative and will be confirmed during the orientation session.
